
At the heart of the community

Professional Advice

- Recent RoSPA inspection and Oxfordshire Playing Field Association recommend replacing playground equipment.
- Oxfordshire Playing Field Association advised doing this all at once to lessen cost and inconvenience.

Why could the playground close?

- Equipment at end of life span.
- Difficult to insure and maintain.
- Contractors will not refurbish, only replace.
- Plan ahead other equipment will likely need to be removed in the next few years.

What can be done?

- 1. Launch a new fundraising team to work closely with SPC.
- 2. Publish results of survey and meeting on souldern.org.
- 3. Design of playground.
- 4. Decide on contractors, compare quotes. OPFA / other villages will advise.
- 5. Second consultation and open meeting with village.
- 6. Announce a fundraising target.
- 7. Create a crowdfunding page (several offers of donation from villagers).
- 8. Apply for grant.
 - * Big Lottery Fund, Landfill Community Fund, advice from OPFA.
- 9. Have fun and meet people!

Grant application success

- Needs: How do we know there's a need for our project?
- Aims: What problems do you hope to solve?
- * Evidence of Needs: Surveys, Open Meetings, Census Data.
- Activities must achieve an outcome e.g. improved rural environment, healthier people.


Response to first consultation

- 28 respondents to survey sent to every household in Souldern.
 - 16 with children < 10 years, 2 with children > 10, 1 child, 2 grandparents,
 7 other villagers.

• Q1: Replacement vs removal.

- 100% of replies in favour of replacement.
- Two comments whether refurb of existing equipment possible.
- * Q2. Alternative use of space. No answers.
- Q3. Areas to be included in a new playground.
- Most popular: 1st :Young Children's Area. 2nd: Towers. 3rd: Swings for older children
- Other ideas: Sheltered area for carers to sit, exercise equipment, dog area.


Points tally: 1st choice = 3 points, 2nd choice = 2 points, 3rd choice = 1 point



Q4. Young children's area equipment:

- Ist choice: Climbing frame + slide. 2nd: swings.
- Other ideas: Wendy house.
- Comments: Very positive and supportive.
 - Keep the big slide most repeated comment.
 - Sand not popular.
 - Ardley playground a good model.
 - Doesn't need to be fancy.

Points tally: 1st choice = 3 points, 2nd choice = 2 points, 3rd choice = 1 point



The Big Slide of Souldern

- A Souldern landmark
- Built in 1975 from railway sleepers
- The metal slide is in good condition
- Significant rot in the legs at ground level
- Closed following RoSPA inspection
- May be possible to rebuild a structure
