Broadband update

Within the last ten days BT have sent us a quote to bring superfast broadband to the village. This now means that parishioners have a choice of two providers who offer very different solutions to the broadband issue.

Starting at **7.30 p.m** representatives from both Gigaclear and BT will be present to give us the details on their different systems.. Souldern vision (Community Led plan)

The questionnaire for the Souldern Vision has now been distributed to every household in the village, and some of the responses are already back with the team. If you have not done so already, please take the time to complete this constructively, as it will be used to help us shape the future services/projects and activities within the village.

2016 Village Event

After the outstanding success of this years event, and the tremendous support that it received from the village, it hasn't taken long for thoughts to turn to an event for next year. The original idea was to hold an event bi-annually, but the team have come up with a great idea for 2016. The Souldern Soap box derby will take place in June, with the venue and rules to be released as soon as they are

finalised. A number of different gradients are being reconnoitred, but the emphasis will be on fun and getting as many village teams entered as we possibly can. Fancy dress and highly decorated soap boxes will be compulsory, and safety of the Participants and spectators will be top of the priorities for the organisers. Watch this space as further details are announced in the coming months.
