Last year OCC did not bother with the verges in the village, apart from one token trim at the end of July. This year we have taken the matter into our own hands, and the verges within the 30 mph zone (not already being looked after by residents) will be tended by the SPC contractor, for which we are being reimbursed by OCC. Hopefully a much better arrangement all round.

The swing bridge on footpath 11 has been rebalanced and can now be operated from either side of the canal.

The Countryside Access team are aware of a dead tree along footpath 23 (leading from Foxhill Lane towards Nancy Bowles Wood). A team will be removing this in the next week or so. Please continue to inform Katy of any other problems spotted on our village footpaths and bridleways.

Horticultural Society

At the Easter egg hunt a competition was launched. Children of all ages from 0-100 were invited to plant Sunflower seeds in their gardens, with the aim of growing the tallest Sunflower. Village Flower Bed

The flower bed at the top of Bovewell was established in 2009 by David Blunt. For the past six years, Marc and Katy Ballmann have been looking after it and donated the plants and bulbs. We now hope someone else would like to have a turn!

There are various established perennials, which provide some colour throughout the year, but summer and winter bedding needs to be planted, and the bed weeded and watered. Therefore, it is a case of planting up twice a year, and then a small amount of maintenance. At the Horticultural Society AGM, it was agreed that the Society would provide funds for the plants. Villagers may also wish to donate any spare bedding plants. As always, the more volunteers the better, but it may be that one person/family should act as overall coordinator.
